Savannah Guides invites you to our next Savannah Guides Field School at Fitzroy Crossing in the stunning Kimberley region of Western Australia. The Napier and Oscar Ranges which dominate the landscape were formed approximately 350 million years ago when the area was covered by a warm tropical sea during the Devonian Period. It features some of the most spectacular landscapes and gorges in the Kimberley. Highlights will include visits to three National Parks (Windjana Gorge, Danggu Geikie Gorge and Tunnel Creek) and Mimbi Caves. During this Field School we will explore this vast region on foot, by bus and boat learning about the ancient landscapes and rock formations, diverse wildlife, along with the rich cultural and spiritual history of the area.

FIELD SCHOOL PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Set on the banks of the mighty Fitzroy River, Fitzroy Crossing is a true outback town, and a great base for exploration of the nearby Devonian National Parks and Mimbi Caves. The Fitzroy Valley is home to five language groups – the Bunuba, Gooniyandi, Nyikina, Wangkatjunka and Walmajarri, each with their own distinctive language and customs. Aboriginal art and culture is very strong in the area. The Crossing Inn, still in operation today, was opened on 5th July 1897 by Joseph Blythe as a store and inn to serve drovers, pastoralists and prospectors in the area. Come with us to discover the rich natural and cultural history of this remote Kimberley town.

Friday 05 October 2018

"The Legend of Jandamarra"

- 6:15am Optional Birdwatching Session
- Today we spend time with local **Traditional Owner Dillon Andrews**, who will tell the story of the **'Jandamarra' legend**; a Bunuba man, who in 1894 led his people against the push for settlement and development of pastoralism of the Kimberley. This fight was waged for nearly three years and Dillon will recount the story as we visit Windjana Gorge, Tunnel Creek and Lillimooloora.
- The Lennard River runs through **Windjana Gorge** in wet weather. The 3.5km long gorge cuts through the Napier Range, part of the ancient Devonian limestone reef that can also be seen at Danggu Geikie Gorge and Tunnel Creek. Spot Freshwater Crocodiles basking in the pools and the Corellas roosting in the waterside trees. Many

marine life forms are fossilised within the limestone of the gorge walls.

- **Tunnel Creek** is Western Australia's oldest cave system. It was the famous hideout used by Jandamarra. He was killed outside its entrance in 1897. These days you can walk through the tunnel. The track runs underground for 750 metres and you wade through several permanent pools. At least five different species of bats call the tunnel home and stalactites descent from the roof in many places. Take a torch, wear sneakers and prepare to get wet!

- Today our **Gooniyandi guides** invite us to join them on an inspiring guided tour of one of Australia's most spectacular and significant, natural geological sites. **Mimbi Caves** is a place of deep spiritual significance to the Gooniyandi people as well as being one of the most significant Devonian fossil sites in the world. This amazing cave system will take your breath away with its vivid colours and beautiful limestone rock formations, while the history and Dreaming stories of the local Gooniyandi people take on a life of their own when shared deep within the heart of the caves. An experience that will stay with you forever.


